Who is participating and what does the program look like?

- ► Babies (sibs from longitudinal study) showing concerns between 12-30 months
- ► Based on Pivotal Response Treatment model (Koegel & Koegel) --adapted
- Parent coaching model
- Home visits with on-line coaching; video review; telephone contact
- ▶ 12 weeks + 12 wk follow-up (6 mo total)

What are we working on?

- ► Functional communication
 - Initial goal = intentional vocalizations
- Positive emotion sharing
 - Find ways to engage child; have fun!
 - Face-to-face interactions
 - Smiling together

Foundation of our model

- ► Behavioural basis:
 - $\blacksquare A \rightarrow B \rightarrow C$
 - manipulate Antecedents and Consequences to foster targeted skills (Behaviours)
- ► Play-based, fluid
- **►** Naturalistic
- ► Integrate strategies into daily routines
 - Play, meals, care-giving activities, outings...

Guiding principles (Antecedents)

- Follow child's lead (motivation)
 - "movement toward..."
- Gain shared control
- Ensure child's attention
- Provide clear opportunities for response
- Intersperse easy (maintenance) and more difficult (acquisition) expectations
- Keep interactions enjoyable for child

Guiding principles (Consequences)

- Reinforce <u>all</u> (vocal) communication attempts
 - Natural Reinforcement
 - Immediate Reinforcement
 - Contingent Reinforcement

Didactic + coaching

- Manual with 8 chapters
- Hands-on, live coaching for 8 weeks
- ► Tapering through weeks 9-12
- ► "Implementation" weeks 12-24
- ► Follow-up at week 24

Progress to date...

- ▶ We have worked with 30 families
- ► Babies have started between 14-31 mos
- Variability re. language level and socialcommunication skills at intake
- All had elevated scores on measures of social communication, behaviour and play

Preliminary outcomes

- In the majority of cases, post-intervention gains in:
- Positive Shared Affect:
 - child smiling and parent smiling
 - shared smiling (parent with child)
 - proportion of smiles to parent (vs. object)
- Communication:
 - Increased responsiveness to verbal models
 - Gains in Receptive and Expressive language
- Reductions in ASD symptomatology (AOSI or ADOS)

Where do we go from here?

- Evaluations of parent satisfaction
- Complete analysis of remaining cases
- Randomized Controlled Trial
 - Autism Speaks CANADA and Sinneave Foundation
 - 60 families (Toronto and Halifax) → 3 years
 - Start March/April 2011
- Community translation
